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Sovereign Harbour Medical Centre



After many years of delays and funding issues, the new Sovereign Harbour Medical Centre will be opening on Wednesday, 7th December 2011.

The current premises at 2 Barrier Reef Way will continue to provide patient services until 6.30pm on Monday, 5th December 2011. The following day, Tuesday, 6th December 2011, the Practice will be closed.

There will be a public open day to visit the new Health Centre for a guided tour on Saturday 17th December 2011 from 10am until 2pm. This is open to everyone, patients as well as non

patients. It will be a visitors' day only, so no medical appointments can be offered for that day.

Dr Adoki and his staff would like to take this opportunity to thank Sovereign Harbour residents for their patience, and for their personal and public support for this project over the years, which has led to this new centre finally being built. They look forward to continuing to serve the local community.

We can only hope that this is the start of a new era for the harbour, with this being just the first piece of the missing social infrastructure to be provided.

Sovereign Harbour Eastbourne Carnival Action Team



Like a rolling stone, the Carnival project is starting to gather momentum. Sovereign Harbour Eastbourne Carnival Action Team (SHECAT) is up and running and our first open meeting was a success. Thank you to everyone who came and joined in so enthusiastically. We had representatives from community groups including SHRA, Harbour Community Association, Maritime Volunteer Service (MVS), Harbour Rotary, Sovereign Harbour Art Group and Brushstrokes Art Group plus a number of individual residents. Andy Holter of the Eastbourne Carnival Committee gave a very informative presentation, which was followed by a lively discussion where various ideas were put forward.

But first, let's remind you of the key facts: Eastbourne Carnival is making a comeback after 20 years thanks to its patron Stephen Lloyd MP, EBC Events and a group of gallant volunteers. The carnival will be on Saturday evening, 2nd June 2012 as part of Eastbourne's Fiesta and the Diamond Jubilee Weekend, so Eastbourne will be really buzzing. The carnival team has already received over 80 expressions of interest with a mix of floats, walking groups and bands who will parade from Fisherman's Green to the Western Lawns where there will be even more entertainment.

Our ambition is to enter the carnival with a Sovereign Harbour community float. The initial response has been very positive: various groups have come

together plus a handful of individual residents. Haven School has said it will join in, and we hope other groups and residents will get on board too. This is going to be an enjoyable, community venture – and one we hope you'd like to be a part of.

The carnival has two very topical themes: Olympics and Royalty. The view at our first meeting was that 'Royalty' offered more scope for colour and fun, and we should create a design that linked this to our modern harbour community. Some good ideas were discussed but we are still some way off finalising the design and another meeting is scheduled for early December to move this forward.

We are going to need lots of help: we want people with construction skills and who are handy with a saw and hammer and folk who like painting, running up costumes or dressing the set. We also need to raise funds. Special thanks go to the MVS who have pledged the cost of our carnival entry and insurance, but we need more and there are some great ideas in the pipeline: a group meal in January when we will be taking over the Happy Dragon in Pevensey Bay plus a race night and a quiz night in the new year. So not only is this a fun project to be involved with but also a great way to meet other local people and make new friends.

Plans Submitted for Retail Park Regeneration



PRUPIM, which is developing the £14 million project on behalf of The Prudential Assurance Company, has announced that the Planning Application for Sovereign Harbour Retail Park has now been submitted and registered with Eastbourne Borough Council. Proposals include a state-of-the-art nine-screen cinema, additional shops and new restaurants.

The submission follows a successful public consultation, which took place in August of this year. More than 430 visitors attended the public exhibition and 240 feedback forms were received at the exhibition and online. 89% of respondents agreed or strongly agreed with the first three questions on the form – ‘Do you think the proposed changes will benefit the area?’, ‘Do you think the proposed changes will create an attractive destination?’ and ‘Do you think the designs are appropriate for the location?’. Since the public consultation the PRUPIM team has been finalising the scheme in light of the comments received.

Adam Birch from PRUPIM said: ‘We believe that the planned regeneration will make a real contribution to the area and the strength of support from Sovereign Harbour residents has shown

that they share our vision for the future. In particular, our proposals will deliver improved shopping and leisure facilities, create jobs and facilitate the cross-harbour bus link. We look forward to continuing to work closely with the local community during the development process’.

The proposed name change – to Sovereign Central – attracted a much more mixed response, with 34% of respondents agreeing or strongly agreeing, 46% disagreeing or strongly disagreeing and 20% ticking ‘No opinion’ or none of the options.

PRUPIM has noted the views expressed and decided that this matter requires separate consideration. The Planning Application has therefore been submitted under the current name ‘Sovereign Harbour Retail Park’. In line with this decision the web site has been rebranded as Sovereign Harbour Retail Park and can now be accessed at www.SovereignHarbourRetailPark.co.uk.

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New Eastbourne Lifeboat Appeal Launched

Eastbourne New Lifeboat Appeal hosted a reception at the Town Hall on the evening of Monday 31st October, where local dignitaries and supporters had the opportunity to view an exhibition of recent rescues, meet the crew and receive an update on build progress of the new Tamar class lifeboat which is on target to be completed early next year.

During the course of the evening the appeal received a boost from the Captains of Royal Eastbourne Golf Club when Kenneth and Yvonne Macdonald presented a cheque for £1,000 to Dr Colin McKee to add to the £4,500 they had donated earlier in the year collected from events they have hosted during their year of joint captaincy.



Following a formal welcome and introduction from Dr Colin McKee, Chairman of the Lifeboat Management Group, presentations were given by Lou Purdy, RNLI area fund raising representative, and lifeboat Coxswain, Mark Sawyer.

In reply, the Mayor of Eastbourne, Councillor Mrs Carolyn Heaps, said the entire town valued the commitment and bravery of the volunteer crew and she felt certain that townspeople, despite the challenging economic climate, would rise to the challenge of raising the £700,000 shortfall in funding of the new lifeboat.



In the period to the end of 2012, Eastbourne RNLI, and its supporters, will be holding fundraising events to raise the final £700,000 needed to meet the £3.3million cost of the vessel.

Check Your Bus Pass



Is your concessionary bus pass due to expire on 31st March 2012?

East Sussex County Council will send out new bus passes at least a week before the date of expiry.

If your personal details have changed, you should notify either:

The concessionary bus pass team on 0345 60 80 194 or buses@eastsussex.gov.uk, your local East Sussex library staff; or Eastbourne Borough Council help desk on 01323 410000 or enquiries@eastbourne.gov.uk

Requests for replacement bus passes due to a change in details which aren't notified before the end of January 2012, may result in a delay in receiving your new bus pass and you could also be charged a £5 administration fee for a replacement.

We Want to Meet Your Needs (by Chief Inspector Jayne Dando)



We want to make sure that we meet the needs of our communities, and that covers many different people across the Town.

We have begun work to develop key themes (known as Equality Objectives) which we hope will make a difference to diverse communities across Sussex and we need your help.

Most people who contact us do so because they need our help, but everyone who contacts us wants to be treated as an individual, to be listened to and for us to do our job as well as possible. RNLI Update

It's been another mixed bag of rescues for Eastbourne lifeboats which now total 130 callouts this year. In addition to the more 'routine' services, we have also been tasked to incidents deep into the shipping lanes.

The latest occasion was to a young man who had been pulled overboard whilst deploying fishing nets from a 2125 tonne Dutch trawler 18 miles out to sea on a dark and horrid night. The majority of fishermen tend not to wear lifejackets, luckily for this young man it wasn't the case and his life jacket undoubtedly saved his life.

He was in the water for almost 30 minutes before being found and it was only the light on his jacket which enabled him to be seen in the darkness.

Having been airlifted to the DGH in Eastbourne suffering from hypothermia I'm pleased to say he has made a full recovery from his ordeal.

Unfortunately the outcome to a later incident was not as good, and our station volunteer doctor and paramedic were unable to save a sick Filipino crewman aboard a passing container ship.

Talking of shipping lanes, maybe some new residents are simply not aware of what is happening over their horizon, this might help. Just over ten miles from Eastbourne (five miles beyond the Sovereign Light Tower) is

a dedicated shipping lane which is six miles wide. This is for all commercial traffic in the Dover Strait heading in a south westerly direction.

A further five miles out from that (the bit in-between being called the separation zone) is another similar lane for traffic heading in the opposite direction. At any given time, day or night, 365 days a year, there are literally hundreds of ships using this highway of the sea, making it one of the busiest shipping lanes in the world.

Our mission is to save lives at sea, that's what the RNLI was founded for and that's what we try and do. We also do our best to save peoples' boats; very rarely we are unable to achieve both.

Last week we were called out when a small yacht with three people on board foundered on the rocks whilst attempting to round Beachy Head Ledge at night. The crew were taken to safety but the yacht was badly holed and could not be saved and had to be left to be claimed by the sea.

Our new lifeboat appeal is well under way and gathering pace. As reported elsewhere, an official reception was held in the Town Hall last week; pledges of support were received from local dignitaries, local businesses and many organisations and individuals keen to help.

Our latest fund raising event was held over the weekend of 12th and 13th November, on the pier. A twenty-four hour hair styling marathon, including an end of pier angling marathon, netted a remarkable £1,300 towards our target of £700,000.
