Eastbourne Police are aware that, for many people, speeding motorists are a priority concern in their area of Eastbourne.



They want to encourage as many volunteers as possible to help tackle this problem by setting up Community Speed Watch groups to catch motorists driving illegally.

If you or anyone you know would be interested in joining or setting up a group we have attached a link to CSW online where you can view videos and register your interest. You would need to join "Eastbourne Community Speedwatch Group" or can form your own group.

Once registered you will need to complete a vehicle recognition test and receive training on the SL700 speed detection device which would be provided by the Neighbourhood Policing Team.

When enough people are registered and appropriately trained they would then be asked to enter their availability onto the system and specify where they would like to conduct speedwatch. The system will then notify you of the time and place where CSW will take place. A member of that group will be responsible for collecting the SL700 from Hammonds Drive Patrol Centre

Police are urging residents to be aware of a new telephone scam following a spate of calls reported to us in Eastbourne yesterday.

In each case the potential victim received a call from a person posing as a lawyer calling himself Max Morris. He said he was calling from Coopers Law Firm and had an American accent. The scammer then stated that the intended victim was involved in a case going to court against or involving them and that they had to call back on a number given. Most of the messages were left on answer phones. He attempted to extract personal information from those he spoke with.

In total 18 such calls were reported to us and thankfully none of the intended victims called back or disclosed any personal information and although many dialled 1471 the number was withheld.

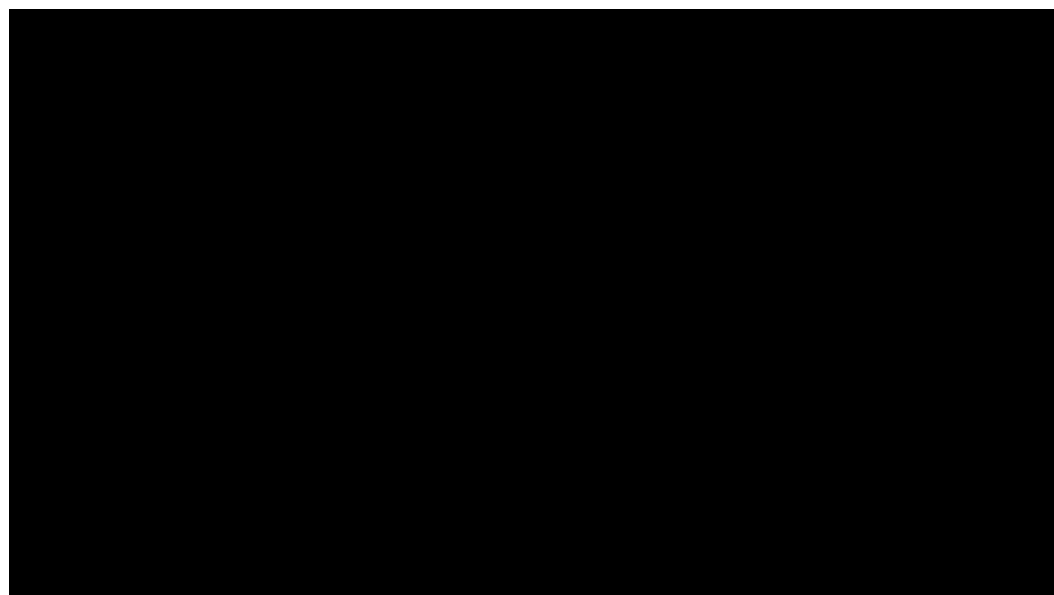

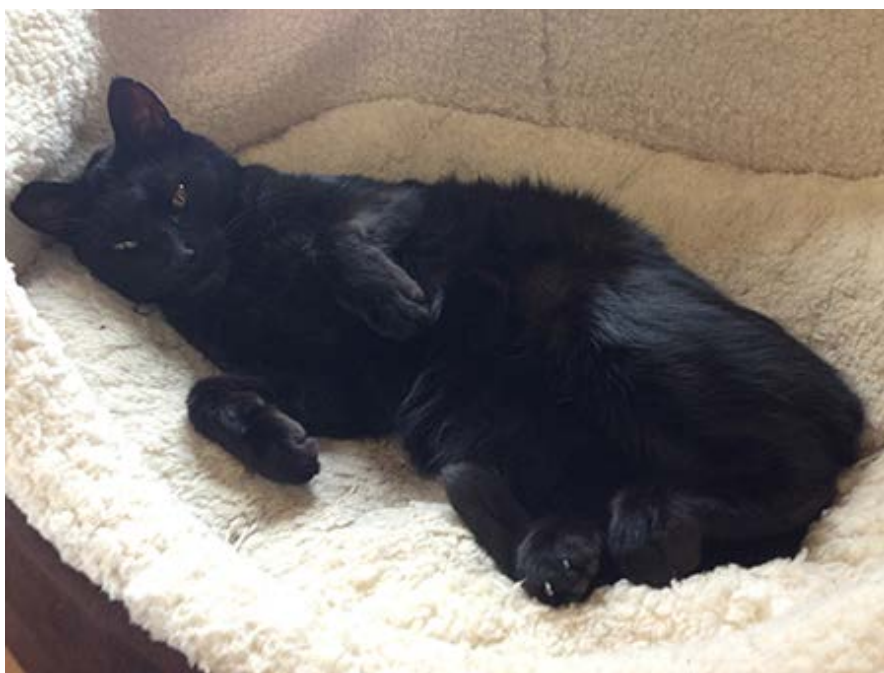

The South East is eligible to bid for £1.2 billion of investment from Central Government through the South East Local Enterprise Partnership (SELEP) which will be directly targeted to further improving our local economy, creating jobs, and crucially, upgrading our transport links. This means the cross-party A27 Campaign – Eastbourne to Lewes - could become a reality if these funds are secured.

The **ambitious programme** set out in the Strategic Economic Plan and Growth Deal was submitted to Government on 31st March 2014. We need to make sure, though, that the right people know just how much we want this investment in our neck of the woods. So it need as many people as possible from Eastbourne and Willingdon to write in supporting this plan, to the **Project Manager Zoe Gordon**.

One or two lines will be fine, and please do remember to mention our section of the A27. We've shown time and again that when our town pulls together, we can be a force to be reckoned with.

13th May 2014

Please be aware that there has been a high volume of scam calls targeting vulnerable members of the local community.

Since Saturday 10th May there have been 26 incidents reported by Eastbourne residents of would be fraudsters calling posing as police officers. The person calls saying that the victim's card had been used to buy items and that the victim needs to call their bank or give them their bank details.



In other cases the caller has again pretended to be a police officer and said they have arrested people who have been found to be in possession of the victims bank account details. They have then tried to trick them by saying they will put them through to the bank for the victim to pass on their bank details.

These are the latest in a series of attempts to dupe people into parting with personal information by pretending to be someone official. The tricksters have also pretended to be a bank employee on some occasions. Fortunately those who received these latest calls became suspicious, did not give any details and immediately contacted Sussex Police.

Please stay vigilant and never pass on bank or card details over the telephone. Legitimate organisations would never ask for this sort of information in this way.

If you receive such calls you should wait at least ten minutes for their line to clear and, if the opportunity arises, dial 1471 to obtain the caller's number. Once certain that the line is clear use your phone, mobile or alternative line, and phone Sussex Police on 101 to report your suspicions.

9th May 2014

Walkers and dog walkers please be aware that there have been a number of thefts from vehicles parked in beauty spot car parks in and around the Eastbourne area over the past week. There were four incidents where a passenger side window was smashed and valuables taken.



Two of the thefts occurred at Butts Brow. On 30th April a bag containing a purse was stolen between 1:15pm and 2:15pm and on 4th May a large tobacco pipe pouch was taken from another vehicle between 3:15pm and 4:15pm.

On 3rd May a shoulder bag containing cash and credit cards was stolen from a vehicle parked in the Friston Forest car park. This happened between 5:40pm and 6:05pm.

On 4th May at the Arlington Reservoir car park another car was broken into and a handbag containing a purse was taken. This incident occurred between 1:30pm and 2:30pm.

The majority of this type of crime is opportunistic and often occurs because valuables have been left on view. The best crime prevention advice is to always take your valuables with you and not to hide things in the glove box.

The final machine will leave the beach today, hopefully heralding the start of summer. It has been an interesting few months, but thankfully the defences have survived, albeit battered and bruised at times.



Dredger Sospan Dau is currently working at Eastbourne for the Council, and will then dredge Sovereign Harbour for Premier Marinas. We hope to get a first delivery of sea dredged aggregate for Sovereign Harbour revetment at some point in May, but I will confirm the details in the coming weeks.

Last week the site received a Gold Award from the Considerate Constructors Scheme, the first time after years of bronze and silver. Only 90 sites reached this level from nearly 9,000 sites registered in 2013, so it is a significant achievement.

One of the comments made by the site monitor related to complimentary letters and emails received from local residents. I have not tried to count the number of emails, letters, cards, telephone calls and personal visits I have had since January thanking us for all the work done this winter, but it must be close to 100. I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has sent a message as each and every one is very much appreciated, especially by machine drivers who are more used to complaints than compliments. And they undoubtedly helped raise our profile with the Scheme monitor as well, so thank you again.

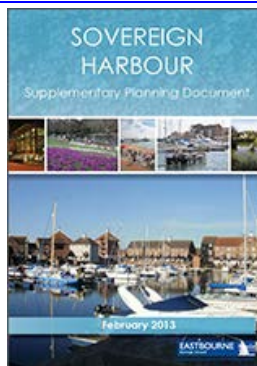

At the April meeting of the Eastbourne Borough Council Planning Committee yesterday evening, the members gave their unanimous approval the the application by Sovereign Harbour Ltd for the completion of the remaining harbour development sites.

Outline consent was given for all sites at this stage, in line with the vision of the Sovereign Harbour SPD. Detailed applications will be submitted for each site as plans come forward.



10th April 2014

I suppose expecting this winter to end without an additional hiccup was too much to expect. The normal hard running surface along the beach at Sovereign Harbour was built up by years of use. Once washed away in February, it was replaced by especially granular material brought round the harbour from Langney, which does not compact so readily.



Hence the road lorries can't get anywhere near the stockpile as they normally would, and have had to tip much further away. As a result we will have to bring the excavator and one dump truck round from Langney so they can move this shingle up to the rocks where it is needed.

The good news is that road lorries will finish tonight, and the excavator/dump truck on Tuesday.

Some final tidying up along the entire frontage with the bulldozers should also be completed by Wednesday

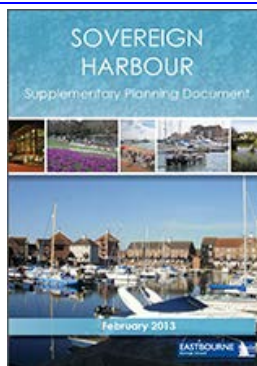

signs have to be removed afterwards.

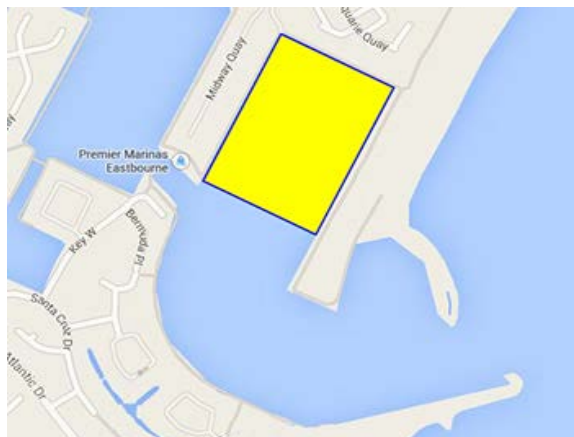
All necessary equipment is provided and petrol costs are reimbursed. All the gardens this year are in a radius of no more than fifteen miles from Eastbourne.

After many years of speculation plans to install berths in the outer harbour have finally been abandoned, due to the ever increasing problems caused by silt.

The SHRA was very disturbed to hear that the developers are considering building a dam across the entrance and fill it in.

A spokesman for the developers said: "We estimate that, if we stick to a maximum of six stories,

we can probably build three hundred apartments on the site."

Eastbourne Borough Council refused to confirm that this would be contrary to the vision of the Sovereign Harbour SPD. A spokesman said: "As this piece of land didn't exist when the SPD was agreed, it doesn't seem to be governed by it."

SHRA chairman, Jan Weeks, said: "When you hear something like this, you'd almost think it was 1st April."

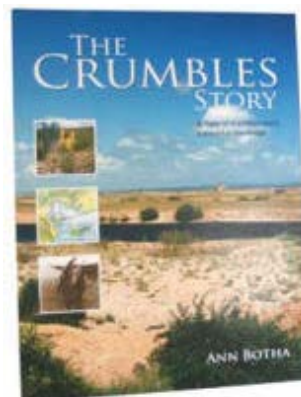


The Crumbles Story - available from SHRA -
