EXCITED new Haven School headteacher Pat Lock said this week everything is on course for a smooth opening in September.

The Language Point school (right) which was wasteland a few months ago — will have all the necessary plumbing, electrics, heating and facilities to operate properly from day one, parents have been assured.

'The builders have had to reschedule their plans but have done very well under the circumstances.'


Although work will continue until December, a temporary internal wall and fencing will keep youngsters well
