

ANNUAL REPORT 2025 – 2026

This report covers the SHRA activities since our last AGM held in 2025.

1. THE SHRA COMMITTEE

2. THE COMMITTEE'S WORK 2025-2026

The committee held monthly meetings throughout the period. We are grateful to the Sovereign Harbour Yacht Club for the use of their facilities.

Site 1a

We have two representatives on Untold Living's engagement committee, which also includes local resident representatives. Untold hosts regular meetings and updates us with the latest news. Construction is yet to commence.

Site 7a

Development of Site 7a, the land adjacent to the Medical Centre, is nearly complete after causing much stress to local residents. Aldi and Maris View Care Home are both open and the McCarthy Stone development is due to open in the autumn. We've established a good relationship with the management of Maris View, and they have become one of our sponsors.

The Locks

We've had a number of meetings with Premier Marina management concerning step-free access to the locks from the Eastbourne side. Some work has been done, but conversations are ongoing about the steepness of the path at the Harbour end of the locks.

Pevensey Bay to Eastbourne Coastal Management Scheme

We continue to engage with the Environment Agency (EA) and monitor progress on their Coastal Management Scheme. It appears initially they will do no more than maintain the present flood management while they debate future plans. The EA has indicated they would not fund flood defence improvements required to be carried out by a commercial company, SHRA therefore remains concerned that should the EA demand Premier carry out such work, the costs will be passed on to the residents through the annual Rentcharge.

Annual Rentcharge

We have had discussions with Premier and the Sovereign Harbour Trust about the ongoing challenges regarding the annual rentcharge. We believe greater transparency is needed on the monies claimed by and paid to Premier Marinas.

CIC Board Vacancy

SHRA have nominated harbour resident and SHRA member Phil Kearney for a vacancy on the board of the Sovereign Harbour Trust and the Sovereign Harbour (Sea Defences) Community Interest Company, which collects and applies money paid to it in accordance with the rentcharge scheme established to fund flood defence at Sovereign Harbour. We initially nominated Keith Bateman, a SHRA committee member and Commodore of the Sovereign Harbour Yacht Club, but Keith has decided to withdraw due to other commitments. The CIC will make a further announcement following its next board meeting.

The Crumbles Retail Park

The drive-thru Costa Coffee and McDonald's in the centre of the car park are open, and we are in regular contact with them and M&G (the owners of the retail park) discussing various issues raised by residents, including the regular emptying of the waste bins.

Information Boards

We've finished the refurbishment of the four Harbour information boards. The bird information, the SS Barnhill and the wildlife information boards have been renewed, and the new Seal board is in place. Thanks once again to Peter Lawrence and Keith Collier for their efforts on this project, and to Rajendra Pisavadia for his designs. We're sure you will agree that these boards add to the enjoyment of both residents of the harbour and the many visitors.

The McCauley Place Open Space

We continued to pursue Eastbourne Borough Council, requesting that they accept responsibility for the awful condition of the open space. Stratton completed the hand-over to EBC some while ago, but EBC would not accept this. Finally, we managed to convince them, and their gardeners cleared the area in June. We will continue to monitor this and alert EBC if the condition deteriorates.

Fishermans Quay

We continue to monitor and speak to Premier and to the Fisherman's representative about the untidiness of the Quay area. This has improved, but we continue to ask for more.

Ongoing Matters

We meet regularly with Premier Marinas to discuss various issues around the Harbour and The Waterfront, including events, maintenance, health and safety and flood defence.

We also meet regularly with our Ward Councillors and the local police. Recent matters under discussion include the changes to Harbour lighting, the removal of bus stops around the Harbour,

We deal with a steady stream of emails from members and offer them advice where we can or, where necessary, raise the matter with other bodies.

Annual Membership

We use the online Membermojo system to manage and renew SHRA membership applications. New members pay an annual subscription fee of £5 per person. All members receive a digital membership card attached to their welcome letter as a PDF file which can be printed or stored as an image. The card is re-issued every year when a member renews. Members can purchase an optional plastic membership card for an annual cost of £5 including postage. All cards carry an expiry date 12 months after a member joins.

Lifetime Members

Before the establishment of the Membermojo annual membership system in 2022, SHRA offered new members a Lifetime membership and a Lifetime membership card. This resulted in a large number of records being retained for Lifetime members who had never been required to renew or update their details, so may no longer be eligible for membership for various reasons.

To confirm the ongoing eligibility of Lifetime members and keep our membership records up to date, we now use the automated Membermojo renewal functionality to require all Lifetime members to renew their membership annually. Lifetime members pay no annual fee to renew every year but can decide to purchase an optional plastic membership card. Lifetime members who do not renew their membership will eventually be removed from the database.

Membermojo Costs

Up to 2,000 members for 1 year = £300. Currently, we have 1,327 members plus 139 members on the expired list, making a total of 1,466 member records in the Membermojo database.

The SHRA launched its first writing competition in conjunction with the Sovereign Harbour Book & Creative Writing Group, which proved popular.
